



Introduction

In the Bargiraj Dynasty, Garhbeta was a small hamlet. As found in history, this place became popular in the art and culture since the 16th century. The river Silabati was a silent spectator of many ups and downs happened in Garhbeta. There is many evidence that occurred in British Rule of oppression and its strong opposition from the people of Garhbeta. To take a frontier role in the development of the nation, the people of Garhbeta established Garhbeta High School in 1888.

It was a milestone in education. The well known leader in 'Quit India' Movement' Late Gobinda Kurnar Singha envisaged to establish one higher educational institutional Garhbeta, and he successfully did this noble work with the full support of the villagers as well as the Zamindar of this area. The auspicious day in which the 'Rarah-Bangla' got the door to higher study was 13th August 1948. Garhbeta had rich cultural heritage in its past. The bank of the holy river Silabati was the mother of many great sons like freedom fighter, nobel educationist, big corporate owner etc. The place with religious interest, enchanting sight of the Mahabharata fame 'Gangani' and the varied beauty of pleasant vast green forest and laterite soil attract many visitors with diverse interest on different occasions throughout the year. Much more water has passed through Silabati, Garhbeta adopted various changes in the course of time. Fertile land, well connected road &

railways and experts in various fields put Garhbeta to its inevitable position in agriculture, business and education.

The college had started its journey from Banerjee danga High School with only 50 students on 12th February 1950 and then the college was shifted to its campus constituted by the generous donation of 2.58 acres of land by the local freedom fighter Late Basanta Kumar Sarkar and 9.56 acres of land by Midnapore Zamindar Company. The college is marching forward with a vision to achieve its mission of catering to higher education for students of Paschim Medinipur and the adjoining district of Bankura and Hooghly. In the 70 years of its long journey started just with a corrugated shade in the jungle, the college has now reached significant height and possesses large buildings, well established laboratories with sophisticated instruments and provided with other basic amenities that are essential for an institution of higher learning. At the inception the College was affiliated to the University of Calcutta with Arts and Commerce stream in intermediate standard. Affiliation upto B.A. (Pass) standard was extended in 1957, followed by B.Sc. (Pass) in 1960 and Mathematics (Hons.) and History (Hons.) in 1964. Subsequently, University of Calcutta granted B. Com (Pass), Zoology (Pass) and Botany (Pass) in 1982 and 1983 respectively. In 1985, the hunger for education of the people of undivided Midnapore received the long waiting and

most coveted gift from Vidyasagar University from UGC as well as Govt. of West Bengal. And Garhbeta College became affiliated to the University and the college steadily progressed in all its dimensions of academic sphere. Now the college offers honours in fourteen subjects arts, science, and commerce along with the newly introduced Santali Hons, and four post-graduate courses in Bengali (M.A.), History (M.A.), Mathematics (M.Sc.) and Zoology (M.Sc.). Besides, there are one major vocational course (O.M.S.P.) and two professional course B.P. Ed, (N.C.T.E approved) & BCA (since 2016) also running in the college. These are remarkable achievement of Garhbeta College, and these will offer higher studies to the students of this locality at their doorstep. There has been continuous research activity in most of the departments as well. Ex-students are also in constant touch with the departments in the perspective of higher studies and research. To send the message that the education is not only for all but for all ages, Garhbeta College has a wing of distance education in its campus namely Netaji Subhas Open University Study Centre. Soon Garhbeta College will take a frontier leadership in the propagation of higher education in the Country.

Field Projects for the academic Session 2019-20

Department of Geography : ----- An educational excursion was conducted by the Geography department for the honors students of B.A./B.Sc. Part-III (CBCS-5th Semester) from 18.09.2019—27.09.2019. In the same academic year for the same students a field study was also done to prepare a field report. It was prepared on physical and socio-economic condition of the people living in the area of Garhbeta Block-I of the district Paschim Medinipore. For the survey we put special emphasis on the Jhan Jhali village of Amlagora gram panchayet. The decision regarding the above mentioned events were taken in a meeting held on 6.8.2019 at the departmental laboratory room of the Geography department in the presence of teachers, Staff and students. In the meeting it was also decided that the excursion to a place in the state of Rajasthan would be conducted under the supervision of Prof. Uttam Sarkar and Prof. Bhanu Kumar Mondal. Sri Kartik Ghosh will join the excursion as a supporting staff. All the students will have to prepare field visit report with the supervision of Prof. Uttam Sarkar. Total thirty eight (38) students of 5th semester participated the excursion and field study. Students were completed their field study report and submitted before the final examination.

Department of Mathematics :----- Topic : Field Work (Compulsory) -----Syllabus--- Application for Optimization problems in real-life problem by visiting any Industry /University/Reputed Institution to understand the practical use of the optimization and making Lab Note Book on the experience gathered during the visit.

Report : Industrial visits represent an important activity for the student studying optimization in Applied Mathematics. This visit contributes to the achievement of various essential learning outcomes and program objectives. This report is an attempt to make the industrial visit an integral part of the optimization course. This is achieved through identifying learning outcomes and a suitable industrial site to achieve them. For this purpose, a fishing harbor was identified as a site to be visited by students. The visit was planned to help students to achieve the learning outcomes. A number of questions in form of surveys, related to the learning outcomes, were prepared and given to the students to answer. The pre-visit, after-visit, and post-visit surveys were aimed at priming the minds of the students, gauging the level of satisfaction, and assessing the level of retention of knowledge, respectively. Students found this method very useful and they were able to remember a fair bit of information after about semester from the trip date. All the students have submitted the survey report to the department and those were placed to the external subject expert. Our objectives have been achieved and assessment was perfectly alright.

During visit, faculties explain the importance of location, shown actual habitat, discussed & informed about all plants groups such as (Algae, Fungi, Bryophytes, Pteridophytes, Gymnosperms, Angiosperms) along with their taxonomy details which includes botanical names & its classification and also economic importance of plant. the student gained desired practical knowledge in the field of botany specifically of nursery plants and their overall nursery management practice.

Department of Zoology :--- Topic : Field Work (Compulsory)

Syllabus: **C2P2:** Report on a visit to National/Biodiversity Park/ Wild life sanctuary. (Semester I) & **DSE1P:** Visit to Forest/ Wild life sanctuary/ Biodiversity Park/ Zoological Park to study behavioural activities of animals and prepare a short report. (Semester V)

Report

Educational excursion to forests, sanctuaries, and national parks is an integral part of the curriculum Zoology. Such kind of study tours provide the opportunity to come close to mother nature's lap and at same time students get the chance to understand nature's law. Following the Honour's curriculum by Vidyasagar University, Zoology department of Garhbeta College has conducted an educational tour to Bhitarkanika National Park, Orissa from 14th November, 2019 to 18th November, 2019. Eight students from first semester and twenty-five students from fifth semester participated in this tour, guided by Mr. Souraditya Chakrabarty (Head of the Department), Dr. Pokhraj Guha (Assistant Professor), Dr. Mamtaj Uddin Ahmed (SACT), and Amerulla Mandal (Laboratory Staff).

Bhitarkanika National Park is the 2nd largest Mangrove ecosystems of India spreading approximately 672 Kms . Vegetation and the species of the sanctuary are comprised of those which are mainly found in the tropical and subtropical inter tidal regions. It is the breeding place for the endangered salt water crocodiles (*Crocodylus porosus*), the Gahirmatha Beach which forms the east boundary of the sanctuary is famous for Olive Ridley Sea Turtles (*Lepidochelys olivacea*). The sanctuary has 215 species of birds including different varieties of kingfisher and the migratory birds from Europe and Central Asia. This sanctuary is the home for many reptiles, mammals and vertebrates which includes the venomous Cobras and Indian Pythons, the endangered water monitor lizards, Chitals, Jungle cat, Wild Pigs, Otter, Rhesus Monkeys, Sambar, Spotted Deer, Wild Boar and the Fishing Cat. The Asian Open Bill, Cormorants, Darters, Black Ibis, Egrets, open billed storks, sand pipers, sea eagles, whistling teals, kites and sea gulls are the frequently noticed avian of the sanctuary. We have visited Chandipur beach in Baleshwar district of Orissa with a goal for documenting the abundance and diversity of marine invertebrate fauna. Students have found a phenomenal biodiversity of various species at this spot including *Physalia* sp., *Obelia* sp., Horseshoe crab, Fiddler crab, Giant mud crab, Sea star, Sea urchin, *Sabella* sp., *Dentalium* sp., *Monetaria* sp. etc. An extensively diverse range of different flora and faune was found at Bhitarkanika National Park, some of the examples are Pointed Stark, Brown Winged Kingfisher, Asian Openbill Stark, Mudskipper, Salt-water Crocodiles etc. At Udabali sea beach we have found *Bullia* sp., *Neris* sp., *Polygordius* sp. etc. As par part of our trip we have visited Bhitarkanika National Park Museum, where skulls of various animals are well preserved and documented. We also visited Panchalingeshwar temple in Baleshwar district. We have performed population density and quadrat study (area-curve method) at various spots, calculated species diversity index (Shannon-Weiner Index). A range of 1.5-3.5 index was observed for coastal species which represents a highly moderate biodiversity. During this study tour we got opportunity to visualize only a glimpse of Indian biodiversity, at the same time we have experienced the culture of Orissa and great perseverance of the residents to protect the nature and natural resources. All the students have submitted the survey report to the department.

Professional courses like B.P.Ed. and BCA have separate uniform.

PAYMENT OF FEES:

1. All payments are to be made in cash in the cash section of the College after the admission to 1st year. Online payment system is expected to be introduced shortly.
2. Payments for field classes and excursions, where required, will have to be made in addition to the admission charge.
3. The entire payment of fees for Self-Financing Courses shall have to be made at the time of admission.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

Any suppression or misstatement of facts or violation of college rules by the students at the time of admission must lead to cancellation of his/her studentship. The authority will not be responsible for that. The students must be cautious about the rules and eligibility at the time of admission. All admissions are provisional. Cutting-Edge Research By Distinguished Faculty Member

Professor Abhijit Banerjee, Associate Professor at the Department of Mathematics has just completed a research project, which is an achievement as a distinguished researcher/faculty member of our college. The detail of the project is given below. The project entitled “*Quantum mechanics of bicomplex Hamiltonian systems*” (Reference no. *ECR/2017/000102*) had been *approved* by the Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), Department of Science and Technology (DST), Govt. of India under Early Career Research award (formerly known as Young Scientist Scheme) on 30.06.2017. The amount of Rs 18,25,560/- had been *sanctioned* by SERB on 12.03.2013 to be implemented *for three years* w.e.f. 16.03.2018, in Krishnath College (presently Murshidabad University), Berhampore, Murshidabad. Further, on 01.10.2019, SERB has *approved the transfer* of this project from Krishnath College to Garhbeta College w.e.f. 30.03.2019. The project work had been *evaluated* by SERB through the Group Monitoring Workshop held on 01-05 February 2021 and has been graded “*satisfactory*”. The motivation of this project was to investigate the problem of non- conservation of (complex) eigen states related to nonlinear parity-time reversal quantum system and the corresponding basic objective was to achieve that conservation by analytic continuation from complex field to multi-complex (at the beginning, the bicomplex one) spaces, specially by tackling the issue of indefinite metric associated to bicomplex space.
